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Introduction

This Annual Report ("Report") has been prepared pursuant to the Continuing Disclosure Agreement ("Disclosure Agreement") executed in connection with the issuance of the Improvement Area ("IA") A 2004 Special Tax Bonds ("Bonds") by IA A of Community Facilities District ("CFD") No. 11 of the Poway Unified School District ("School District") in the amount of \$11,000,000 on April 1, 2004. The Bonds were issued pursuant to a Bond Indenture dated March 1, 2004 by and between the School District on behalf of IA A of CFD No. 11 and Zions First National Bank, as fiscal agent ("Fiscal Agent"). Dolinka Group, LLC has been retained by the School District to act as dissemination agent ("Dissemination Agent"). The Bonds were issued to (i) finance, either directly or indirectly, the acquisition and construction of certain public improvements of the City of San Diego, (ii) fund a separate reserve fund for the Bonds, (iii) pay interest on the Bonds through October 1, 2005, (iv) pay certain administrative expenses of the CFD, and (v) pay the costs of issuing the Bonds. All capitalized terms not defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Disclosure Agreement.

II. Principal Amount of Bonds Outstanding
